Faith

I-Man having the faith of Ras Tafari 1961 and was a member of the 12 Tribes of Israel from 1965-1968. I have represented the Rastafari Movement Association (RMA) as Chairman from 1968-1974. I also represented Independent Trade Action Council (ITAC) from 1965 –1985. I have also been honoured with the Leonard P. Howell Award for Dedication and Hard Work. I was also honoured on Black Friday in 1997 when the Rastafari Movement commemorated the massacre and shooting of Rastafari People in Coral Garden.

Education

I-Man attended three different schools - the Ebenezer School at Darling Street in Kingston and the Greenwich Town Elementary School, then to the Roman Catholic School at North Street in Kingston.

Employment History & Union Activity

For 24 years, I worked for the government in the Public Cleansing Department (PCD) of the Kingston and St. Andrew Corporate (KSAC) area, as a garbage lorry driver.

From 1968 –1985, I was President of the Public Cleanisng Workers Union within the Department, where I represented some six hundred workers. I was elected to serve on the Board of the PCD Credit Union. After 3/12 years, I was I-lected to the Credit Committee as Chairman up to 1995, when the authorities made that Department and its workers redundant.

Leadership & Lobbying

In March 1995 I was I-lected Chairman out of a three (3) day conference. My mandate was to set up a provisional structure governmentally in order to fulfil the command of His Imperial Majesty (HIM), who told the Rastafari Community to organise and centralise the Rastafari Movement.

From 1996-1998, I-Man was a member of the Legalize Ganja Campaign. During the year 2000, I-Man was also the Acting Chairman of the Rastafari Ivine Government.

At present I am the Chairman of the RastafarI International Theocracy Assembly with an office at 26 ½ Mark Lane in Kingston and I am still serving the Rastafari Centralization Organization (RCO) for the past seven years as President.
